Storytelling in the Adult Classroom

Grammar-Less ESL Instruction

In this presentation, I will introduce these lines of thought and also offer reflections from my personal teaching experience that have led me to severely cutting back on explicit grammar instruction.

Between 2012 and 2017, Amarillo College implemented their first I-BEST models in C.N.A., truck driving, basic welding, and automotive. During that time, the program was very successful and moved from 100% state and federal grant funds to institutional funds with two of the four programs. Currently, the Associate Deans of Career Tech Ed (CTE) and Academic Success are rebuilding the I-BEST model across CTE programs of study using braided state, federal, and institutional funds to ensure institutional sustainability when grant funds are no longer available.

Exploring the Adult ESL-to-Credit Pipeline in Texas Community Colleges

In Texas, there is no state-level oversight guiding students' transition from adult ESL, or adult education, and credit-level courses, even though students who begin in adult ESL programs at a community college may transition through degree programs at the same institution. Previous researchers have documented how adult educators and credit-level course instructors are often siloed in different departments with different institutional funding sources and reporting requirements (Boylan, 2004; Harklau 2000; Tucker, 2006). Such siloing results in limited opportunities for adult ESL practitioners to observe first-hand the academic and linguistic skills students need in order to navigate between adult ESL, ESOL, and credit-level classes—even when they occur on the same campus. However, the available research on potential collaboration or overlap between adult ESL and credit-level courses (e.g., Boylan) is dated and does not consider how Texas-specific policies, such as the Adult Education literacy standards (TWC, n.d.) or mandates for developmental education (THECB, 2015), may impact students' experiences transitioning from adult ESL to credit-level courses.

In this session, adult educators are invited to participate in a focus group exploring their perspectives regarding the Adult ESL to Credit class pipeline at Texas community colleges. The focus group will include discussion about the challenges and successes faculty, administrators, and institutions face in supporting students' transition from adult ESL or ESOL courses into credit-level courses. Adult educators will gain insight into the unique transition pipelines at various Texas Community colleges as well as other practitioners' perspectives on how to support multilingual adult students who wish to pursue an education beyond the adult ESL classroom.

Results from the focus group will inform a larger study on (mis)alignment between adult ESL and credit-level courses and programs in the state of Texas.

Creating E-Portfolios with Google Sites

The e-portfolio is a valuable learning and assessment tool that encourages self-reflection on learning processes and products. Three types of e-portfolios are common: learning, assessment, and showcase. For classroom use, learning e-portfolios created throughout the semester can be repurposed for use as assessment or showcase e-portfolios at the semester’s close.

Prior to this session, I will create an example of a learning e-portfolio focused on career and college exploration. During the session, teachers will complete a checklist that helps them decide on the purpose and content of the e-portfolio. As I demo how to create a Google Suite, participants with Google accounts and mobile devices with Internet access may create their own. Participants will learn how to add, delete, and format text, backgrounds, images, pages, and links and also how to share their site privately or to the public. Finally, I will provide a list of recommended online Google Site tutorials.

The expectation for workshop participants is that they and their students have regular access to either their institution’s or their own computers or mobile devices so that the e-portfolios can be linked to classroom instruction as much as possible. Workshop participants should be comfortable using email, uploading and downloading files, browsing online, and searching for files on their computer or flash drive. Also, teachers should be working with students that already know how to use the Internet, send and receive emails, and recover lost passwords.
